**11. Detailed statement of the purpose for which the money will be used.**

The purpose of the requested funding is to prepare the 2011 Panhandle Area Water Plan. The updated water plan is intended to meet legislative and regulatory requirements while addressing changed conditions since the completion of the 2006 Plan. The Panhandle region continues to experience drought conditions, severely limiting its surface water use. This has resulted in increased interest in groundwater development. In addition, there have been significant and unanticipated changes in the agricultural industries, which account for most of the total water use in the Panhandle planning area. Some of these changes are expected to be long-term trends that will dramatically affect the composition of livestock operations and crop mix leading to a significant change in water usage within the region. Since much of the water for the Panhandle area is from the Ogallala Aquifer, it is imperative to assess the potential impacts of these regional changes to the supplies available from this important resource. This planning grant outlines the activities necessary to address these changed conditions to maintain the quality and integrity of the Panhandle Area Water Plan and the planning process.

**12. Detailed description of why state funding assistance is needed.**

**Base Funding Request**

The Legislature has mandated that the regional water plans be updated every five years. The Panhandle Area Water Planning Group is expected to produce its next plan by

January 2011. The Legislature has allocated funding for a portion of this effort and is expected to allocate additional funding in 2009 to provide the funds necessary to complete the 2011 regional water plans. It is appropriate for the TWDB to award funds to the Panhandle Area Water Planning Group to enable them to meet the state-mandated requirements.

The base funding request is to meet legislative and regulatory requirements, including the public participation process outlined by the Legislature. The TWDB has identified required components for the 2011 regional water plans that will require the Panhandle Area to review and update each of the ten chapters of the 2006 Panhandle Area Water Plan. More detailed descriptions of the required activities for each chapter update are included in the Scope of Work in Exhibit IV. The base funding activities do not include funding requests for the significant changed conditions for the agricultural industry or additional studies of water availability. Funding for these studies are requested under "Additional Funding Request".

The TWDB has proposed a budget allocation for each region for the base funding. The Panhandle Area has adjusted allocations by chapter in an attempt to honor the total base funding allocation amount, but to properly prepare an updated plan for the Panhandle Area funding beyond the original proposed budget is required. The amount required to complete the base plan update is approximately 10 percent above the proposed allocation by the TWDB.

#### **Additional Funding Request**

To address the significant changed conditions in the Panhandle Region, additional data is required on water use and available supplies. Much of this effort will be focused on changes associated with the agricultural industries in the region, current drought and the impacts to the Ogallala Aquifer. Since the Ogallala Aquifer is a limited resource, it is critical to have an accurate assessment of the current supply in the region and the future demands placed on the region's water resources. Additional study is also proposed to assess the potential factors impacting the available surface water supplies from Lake Meredith. Without these studies, the integrity and usefulness of the Panhandle Water Plan may be compromised.

#### **Task 2A: Revisions to Irrigation and Livestock Demands**

Since agricultural water use accounts for an estimated 92% of total water use in the Panhandle Planning Area it is imperative to have an accurate assessment of this water use to have any realistic water planning efforts in the region. Nearly all of the water used for irrigated agriculture is obtained from the Ogallala Aquifer, and both historical and future increases in demands impact the available supply from this source. Given the use of the Ogallala Aquifer in the region, it is critical to have an accurate assessment of the current supply and the future demands placed on the region's water resources. Therefore, it is critical to the development of a water plan for the Region that irrigated crop water use, livestock water use and the resultant potential impacts on water conservation strategies developed/evaluated in the previous planning effort are re-evaluated.

#### Task 2B: Revisions to Population and Municipal Demands

The tremendous growth in the dairy industry and associated agricultural industries has prompted additional growth in populations to support these industries. A new cheese plant in Dalhart (Hilmar Cheese Company) opened this year that will double cheese production in Texas. Other manufacturing facilities are opening in other cities in the Panhandle. This task would review the projected populations for municipalities that are showing increased population growth.

#### Task 2C: Revisions to Mining Demands

During recent review of mining demands in the Panhandle it became apparent that some of the demands may be under estimated. This task proposes to review the mining demands in light of data collected by the Groundwater Conservation Districts and Railroad Commission. While mining water use is not a large component of the region's total water use, it does represent a significant use in some counties.

#### Task 3A: Refinement of Northern Ogallala GAM and Supply

The Northern Ogallala GAM is the primary tool for estimating water supply from the Ogallala Aquifer for the region. Accurate descriptions of the input parameters, including pumpage amounts, spatial locations, geologic data (well logs) and recharge/return flows, are important to have a validated model. Since the Northern Ogallala GAM was developed, additional information has been collected and regional changes to water use have occurred that warrant review and possible refinements to the Northern Ogallala GAM. This task proposes to develop these updated input parameters and assess the impacts to water availability to the Panhandle Planning Area. In addition, the Managed Available Groundwater (MAG) values for the Ogallala Aquifer are expected to be available by December 2008, and the region would like to incorporate these values into the 2011 water plan. The results obtained from these studies will be used by the region and water managers to guide the management of this important resource.

#### Task 3B: Surface Water Study – Lake Meredith

The current drought has greatly impacted the surface water supplies in the Panhandle region. Lake Meredith is at a historical low and the reliable supply from this source has decreased from over 70,000 acre-feet per year to about 30,000 acre-feet in 2008. The impact of the reduced surface water supplies to the Panhandle Planning Area is great. Without renewable surface water, the region must rely on groundwater. To better understand the current decline in surface water supplies and assess whether this supply reduction is transient or a long-term trend, it is proposed to conduct a surface water study on the potential causes of reduced inflows to the Lake Meredith watershed.

#### Task 4A: Revisions to Water Management Strategies due to Changes Associated with Tasks 2A, 2B, 2C and 3A.

Because of the potential changes to demands and water supplies associated with Tasks 2A, 2B, 2C and 3A, there is a high probability that new needs will be identified and new water management strategies will need to be developed. A complete review of the potential irrigation conservation strategies is needed in light of changes to production and crop types. Also, it is anticipated that many users of the Ogallala Aquifer will require review and revisions to water management strategies.



Task 6A: Updated Water Conservation Summary (Associated with Tasks 2A and 4A)

This task is required as a result of the updated water management strategies developed in Task 4A. New water conservation strategies will need to be discussed in Chapter 6.

Task 6B: Water Conservation Summary to Water Conservation Advisory Committee

The Water Conservation Advisory Committee has requested that the regions submit a summary of the water conservation activities within the region and the recommended strategies and conservation savings estimated. This task would compile a list of the recommended conservation strategies and the associated water savings, which would then be submitted to the Advisory Committee.

**13. Identify potential sources and amounts of funding available for implementation of viable solutions resulting from proposed planning.**

Most of the funding for the Panhandle Area water supply projects generally is obtained through cash reserves or bond financing by the respective sponsor of the project. Additional funds have come from federal and state programs. Implementation of the projects covered in the proposed 2011 Panhandle Area Water Plan will likely be financed primarily from Panhandle Area water suppliers, with assistance from TWDB loan programs and other state and federal programs.

Note that levels of funding from the above sources vary by program. In the Panhandle Region, TCBD program limits applications for assistance to \$250,000 per project, yet programs offered by USDA-RUS, USDA-RD, TWDB, etc. have much higher funding capacities. Bonds/Certificates of Obligation are limited by credit standing and repayment capacity of issuing entity.

The Panhandle Area Water Planning Group approved the consultant team of Freese and Nichols, Inc., Texas A&M (Agricultural Experiment Station, Amarillo), and the Bureau of Economic Geology. Freese and Nichols will be the lead consultant. This team has worked together with the Panhandle Area Water Planning Group since the first round of regional water planning. The resumes for the consultants are included in Exhibit V.

**DETAILED SCOPE OF WORK  
PANHANDLE AREA WATER PLANNING GROUP**

The scope of work for the development of the 2011 Panhandle Area Water Plan is comprised of two components: the base funding tasks (minimum activities to meet legislative and regulatory requirements) and additional funding tasks (additional activities necessary to accurately reflect changed conditions). Scopes of work and corresponding budgets for each chapter are discussed below and are distinguished between base funding and additional funding activities. The minimum activities necessary to meet legislative and regulatory requirements that exceed the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) estimated base funding by task are identified as “additional base funding”.

**Chapter 1. Description of Region**

The objective of this task is to update the description of the region in the 2006 Panhandle Water Plan. It will require updating the text to describe changed conditions and new studies completed since the 2006 Water Plan.

**This task will include the following:**

- Revise text to reflect changed conditions in the Panhandle Region. This will include discussions of the recent growth in the dairy industries, increased irrigated agriculture due to increases in commodity prices and demands for ethanol, increases in wind power generation and other changes identified during the planning process.
  - Update historical and projected water use by major use category, as needed.
  - Update descriptions of wholesale water providers, historical water use and service connections, as needed.
  - Review and update threatened and endangered species in the Panhandle Planning Area
  - Update the descriptions of studies and plans completed since the 2006 water plan.

**Base Funding Request .....\$10,000**

- Update current preparation for drought conditions.
- Add information compiled by the TWDB from water loss audits performed by retail public utilities pursuant to 31 TAC §358.6.

**Additional Base Funding Request .....\$2,600**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 1 of the 2011 Panhandle Area Water Plan.



## **Chapter 2. Current and Projected Population and Water Demands**

The focus of this task is to update projected populations and water demands based on changed conditions. The Texas Water Development Board will not be developing new population or water demand projections for the 2011 regional water plans with the exception of steam electric power demands.

Agricultural water use accounts for an estimated 92% of total water use in the Panhandle Region. Therefore, to have any realistic water planning efforts in the Region, it is imperative to have an accurate assessment of water use in this sector. Since the last water plan, there have been significant and unanticipated changes in the agricultural industries in the Panhandle Region. Some of these changes may be temporary adjustments to current economic factors, but others are long-term trends that will dramatically affect the composition of livestock operations and crop mix leading to a significant change in water usage within the Region.

In the livestock industry, there has been (and will be) tremendous growth in the dairy industry that was not anticipated in the previous plan. A new cheese plant in Dalhart (Hilmar Cheese Company) opened this year that will double cheese production in Texas. By the time it reaches capacity (within three years), it will require the production from 45,000 to 50,000 dairy cows. This not only affects the water use by that industry, but will have a significant impact on the crop mix in the Region. Increases in silage and to a lesser degree, alfalfa hay production which are both high water use crops will have to occur to support the influx in dairy cows. On the other hand, rising commodity prices have slowed or reversed the growth in the feedlot and swine industries that were anticipated in the previous plan. These changes represent both geographical and quantity changes to demands on the region's water sources.

Changing commodity prices primarily due to the increased demand for ethanol production and other food products have resulted in a shift within the Region to higher water use crops such as corn, an expansion in irrigated acreage and an increase in double cropping. For example, Texas Agricultural Statistics Service reported that corn acreage jumped 34% (220,000 acres) between 2006 and 2007 in the High Plains. Seed dealers in the Region are reporting increased early sales of corn seed in 2008 over 2007 suggesting the short term trend in corn production is continuing upward in the Region.

Returns to irrigated agricultural production have risen dramatically in the last two years. For example, the value of water used in corn production calculated as the returns over variable cost divided by the acre-inches (acin) applied increased from an average of \$3.00/acin (2002 – 2004) to \$9.20/acin in 2007. The 2008 return is projected to be \$17.84/acin. Producers have responded by increasing double cropping and bringing formerly irrigated land back into production.

Since nearly all of the water used for irrigated agriculture is obtained from the Ogallala Aquifer, these increases in demands (both historical and future) impact the available supply from this

source. Given the Ogallala Aquifer is a limited resource, it is critical to have an accurate assessment of the current supply in the region and the future demands placed on the region's water resources. Therefore, it is critical to the development of a water plan for the Region that irrigated crop water use, livestock water use and the resultant potential impacts on water conservation strategies developed/evaluated in the previous planning effort are re-evaluated.

As such, this task will include revisions to the irrigation and livestock demands and review with possible revisions to population and municipal water demands.

**The base task will include the following:**

- Review newly developed steam electric power demands
  - Revise tables and figures with new demands
  - Request revisions to demands as needed
- Review and update demands on wholesale water providers, including new and changed contracts, including updating TWDB database as needed.

**Base Funding Budget .....\$10,000**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 2 with minimal to no changes to population or demands.

**Tasks requested under additional funding (changed conditions) include:**

**Task 2A: Irrigation and Livestock Demand Revisions**

- Develop new irrigation and livestock demands for all counties in the Panhandle Planning Area using the TAMA irrigation and livestock model.
  - Review prior agricultural water use estimates for eight major irrigated crop categories. Add new crop sectors that have emerged within the region since the prior estimates.
  - Update acreages, irrigation application data by producers and the latest average ET demand data to update water use estimates.
  - Document model assumptions on updated producer adoption rates and aquifer water availability. Develop technical memorandum with supporting data.
  - Collect recent data on livestock production and develop anticipated livestock trends. Update livestock water use by industry type.
  - Report updated irrigation and livestock water use by county and river basin.
- Submit revisions to demands to TWDB with required documentation.
- Revise text, tables and figures in Chapter 2 with new demands.
- Review updated TWDB database.

**Additional Funding Request – Irrigation & Livestock Demand Revisions.....\$59,300**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 2 with updated irrigation and livestock demands.

**Task 2B: Municipal Demand Revisions**

- Survey municipal water user groups with 2007 populations greater than projected in the 2006 plan and solicit input on population and water demands. Develop revised projections if needed.
- Submit revisions to demands to TWDB with required documentation.
- Revise text, tables and figures in Chapter 2 with new demands.
- Review TWDB database, as needed.

**Additional Funding Request – Municipal Demand Revisions.....\$12,000**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 2 with updated population and municipal demands.

**Task 2C: Mining Demand Revisions**

- Review Groundwater Conservation Districts’ records and available data from the Railroad Commission on mining water use and update mining demands, as needed.
- Submit revisions to demands to TWDB with required documentation.
- Revise text, tables and figures in Chapter 2 with new demands.
- Review TWDB database, as needed.

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 2 with updated mining demands.

**Chapter 3. Water Supply Analysis**

This task focuses on updating water supplies in the Panhandle Planning Area based on changed conditions and requirements for the 2011 regional water plans. For the 2011 plans, surface water supplies must include reporting of firm yield. Allocations of supply can be limited to safe yield supply, operational yield or other factors. Groundwater supplies must comply with Managed Available Groundwater (MAG) values as determined by the TWDB and Groundwater Management Areas if this information is available.

For the Panhandle region, the MAG values for the Ogallala Aquifer are expected to be available by December 2008, and the region would like to incorporate these values into the 2011 water plan. However, the increased pumpage of the Ogallala Aquifer from increased agricultural demands may have impacted current and future groundwater availabilities. Also new geologic data of the aquifer have been collected. These changes warrant additional review and possible refinements of the Northern Ogallala GAM. These potential changes were discussed with the TWDB prior to the development of this planning grant request. The TWDB confirmed that refinements to the Northern Ogallala GAM would qualify as eligible activities for regional water planning grant funds.

In addition to the changes in demands for groundwater, drought has greatly impacted the surface water supplies in the Panhandle region. Lake Meredith is at a historical low and the reliable supply from this source has decreased from over 70,000 acre-feet per year to about 30,000 acre-feet in 2008. Other regional surface water sources, Lake Palo Duro and Lake Greenbelt, are also in drought conditions. The impact of the reduced supplies to the Panhandle region is great. Without renewable surface water, the region must rely on groundwater. To better understand the current decline in surface water supplies and assess whether this supply reduction is transient or a long-term trend, it is proposed to conduct a surface water study on the potential causes of reduced inflows to area reservoirs. This project proposes to limit its focus to the Lake Meredith watershed. This task does not include re-evaluating the yield of Lake Meredith. If there is a change in drought conditions in the basin warranting re-evaluation of the lake’s yield, this effort will be requested for funding from the set-aside funds.

**The base task will include the following:**

- Update supplies available to water user groups based on changes in contracts and/or connections to new supplies. No new supply yield analyses will be conducted under the base funding.
- Update supplies available to wholesale water providers based on changes in contracts and/or connections to new supplies. No new supply yield analyses will be conducted under the base funding.
- Update TWDB database as needed.

**Base Funding Request .....\$10,000**

- Describe findings from the 1<sup>st</sup> biennium study on aquifer recharge. This will include a synopsis of the recharge study in the 2011 plan with recommendations for modifications to the Ogallala GAM.

**Additional Base Funding Request .....\$2,500**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 3 with minimal to no changes to source supplies or distribution of supplies.

**Tasks requested under additional funding (changed conditions) for water supply studies include:**

**Task 3A: Refinement of Ogallala Groundwater Availability**

**Task 3A.1 Refine Ogallala GAM demands and allocations to users**

- Develop water availability for the Ogallala Aquifer by county and basin based on Managed Available Groundwater (MAGs) values provided by the TWDB and GMA 1. [Note: GMA 1 and TWDB will develop MAGs based on current Northern Ogallala GAM.] Assign water to users considering geographical constraints, infrastructure, contracts and other constraints as appropriate.
- Using data collected under Task 2A and other available data from the Groundwater Conservation Districts, develop historical (1998 to 2007) and future demand projections on the Ogallala aquifer.

**Additional Funding Request – 3A.1 MAG Update & Allocation to users.....\$15,000**

**Deliverable:** Updated distribution of Ogallala water supplies to users based on MAGs and updated water use data for input to Northern Ogallala GAM.

**Task 3A.2 Refine Ogallala GAM and Recast Water Use Projections for GAM input**

- Assign the historical and future groundwater demand to be met from the Ogallala aquifer to locations. Municipal, Industrial, Mining, and some Livestock water use can be allocated to specific wells. Special effort will be focused on using new information to allocate pumping to specific wells. Residential (non-urban) water demand will be allocated on the basis of census data. Using a cutoff of minimum population density is needed to avoid assigning negligible pumping rates to many model cells. Irrigation demand will be allocated on the basis of GIS data sets, also following TWDB protocols.
- Once groundwater withdrawal has been allocated to model cells representing the Ogallala aquifer, the information will be translated into input for the wells package of Modflow.
- Incorporate irrigation return flows as appropriate. [Note: Irrigation return flow calculations can be made using various assumptions. Dutton and others (2000) added return flow estimates to the input for recharge rate. They had found that uncertainty in return flow estimates was the same as the uncertainty in model calibration without considering return flow. If the downward flow rate of return flow is less than the rate at which the water table drops in a given area, no return flow recharges the aquifer. It is possible, therefore, that omitting return flow might be a reasonable simplification.]
- Run Ogallala GAM with updated inputs.
- Conduct sensitivity analyses with new data. This will include varying the assumptions about pumping rates. Increasing and decreasing pumping rates by some percentage and rerunning the Modflow model will show how that uncertainty impacts model predictions. This is needed in identifying areas that might have shortages in water. Adjust model calibration if needed.
- Incorporate any recommended revisions to the recharge values in the GAM based on the 1<sup>st</sup> biennium recharge study.
- Run GAM and review model results to historical water levels. Re-calibrate model if needed.

- Collect additional geologic data from new well data. Incorporate new geologic information into the Northern Ogallala GAM to refine the aquifer bottom layer. Run GAM and compare results to historical measurements. Refine calibration, if needed.
- Compare storage in updated Northern Ogallala GAM to storage in current Northern Ogallala GAM. If significant differences in storage are identified, present data to GMA 1 for consideration of developing new MAGs. With GMA 1 and TWDB input, consider refining water availability with updated availability values. Note differences in the regional water plan.
- Submit refined Northern Ogallala GAM to TWDB with required documentation.
- Groundwater consultant attends up to 3 Panhandle Water Planning Group meetings.

**Additional Funding Request –3A.2 GAM Refinements .....\$90,000**

**Deliverable:** Updated Northern Ogallala GAM and updated available supply from the Ogallala.

**Task 3A.3 Update Chapter 3 with revisions**

- Revise text, tables and figures in Chapter 3 with new supplies.
- Update TWDB database.

**Additional Funding Request – 3A.3 Chapter 3 Update .....\$20,000**

**Deliverable:** Updated Chapter 3 with changes to Ogallala supplies and distribution of supplies to water users.

**Tasks requested under additional funding for surface water studies include:**

**Task 3B: Surface Water Study**

- Collect historical data on precipitation, rainfall intensities, temperature, stream flows, land use practices, acreages of brush and salt cedar, spring flow, Soil Conservation Service (SCS) impoundment, other surface impoundments, groundwater levels and other data determined relevant. Data should include the Texas Panhandle and surrounding areas in the Lake Meredith watershed below the Logan gauges (USGS 07227000 and 07227100).
- Obtain available studies on brush control, precipitation, and other relevant studies.
- Analyze trends of average annual and seasonal values of rainfall, temperature, and streamflows. Analyze trends in rainfall intensity, spring flows, small impoundments, groundwater levels and other relevant data. To the extent that data are available, analyze historical trends in land use practices and brush infestation.
- Develop historical estimates of rainfall amounts over the contributing watershed between the Logan gauges and the Amarillo gauge (USGS 07227500) and between the Amarillo gauge and Lake Meredith. Calculate historical precipitation to runoff ratio and analyze trends of this ratio.
- Examine collected data for correlations between historical trends in rainfall to runoff ratio and other historical data collected above. Identify trends within the Lake Meredith

watershed. Identify areas that may merit further study to help quantify impacts on future water supplies in the Panhandle Region.

- Prepare a draft report including methodology, results and conclusion. Submit draft report to the planning group and TWDB for review. Address comments by the planning group and TWDB and submit a final report.

**Additional Funding Request – 3B: Surface Water Study.....\$52,000**

**Deliverable:** Study report to be incorporated in the 2011 Panhandle Area Water Plan.

**Chapter 4. Identification, Evaluation and Selection of Water Management Strategies**

The objective of this task is to update water management strategies in the 2006 Panhandle Water Plan and evaluate new strategies that may be identified for the 2011 water plan. As part of the 2011 plan, the Panhandle Water Planning Group will be able to identify alternative water management strategies. All alternative strategies will be evaluated to the same level as recommended strategies. Also, capital and annual cost estimates for all strategies must be updated to 2007 dollars.

Because of the potential changes to demands and water supplies, there is a high probability that new needs will be identified and new water management strategies will need to be developed. All water user groups and wholesale water providers will be contacted to verify the recommended strategies in the 2006 regional water plan are still applicable and identify potential new strategies that the entity may be considering.

**The base task will include the following:**

- Update water needs analysis for water user groups with changed demands and/or supplies
  - Steam electric power
  - Others identified in Chapter 3 due to changes in supplies and/or contracts
  - Others due to changed conditions identified by the RWPG or public
- Update water needs analysis for wholesale water providers with changed demands and/or supplies
  - Changed contracts as identified in Chapter 2
  - Changed supplies
- Survey all water user groups and wholesale water providers to confirm need analysis and recommended water management strategies.
- Update text, tables and figures in Chapter 4 of the water plan.
- Update TWDB database as needed.

**Base Funding Request .....\$20,430**

### **SUMMARY OF ASSIGNMENTS/DUTIES:**

Responsible for the irrigation program of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station of Amarillo, Texas at three locations of the organization. Additionally, manage a 326 acre Texas A&M research center farm located 10.5 miles north of Dumas, Texas. Responsible for all aspects of operations, irrigation use, efficiency and conservation for both sprinkler and surface irrigation and crop production systems, including sales. The irrigation program involves the research of water management, water application, soil conservation, reduced tillage and manure utilization in irrigation and related cropping systems. Sprinkler operations include the evaluation of existing nozzle types and application efficiencies and its respective effectiveness in High Plains agriculture. Responsibilities also entail consistent computer hardware and software upgrading and supervision of student and support staff personnel. Efforts also entail incorporating new computer technologies in agriculture research for improved acquisition and control systems.

Responsibilities additionally include maintaining an excellent working and technical relationship with personnel of the USDA-ARS, North Plains Water District, High Plains Underground Water District, Panhandle Water Authority, Texas A&M University, West Texas A&M University, Texas Cooperative Extension, numerous commodity groups as well as the governing political water entities and agencies of the State of Texas.

As a registered professional engineer at the Amarillo/Etter location, responsibilities also include electrical and structural design aspects of location facilities. These include research irrigation systems for a multi-disciplinary team of scientists.

### **CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS:**

35 year career efforts have been directed toward water conservation. Early technical career endeavors involved the assessment of converting high-pressure sprinkler systems to lower pressure systems in the Texas Panhandle. This work mainly involved center pivot application devices. Evaluations resulted in significant energy savings (pressure reductions from 90 psi to 10 psi) for producers and the implementation of these technologies are still in practice today. I co-designed and fabricated the four, large, weighing monolithic lysimeters at the USDA –ARS at Bushland. These world class units were constructed for validating crop coefficients for High Plains producers. These ET facilities have become the cornerstone of Texas Panhandle and surrounding state irrigation scheduling data. In recent years, I have also designed and installed another set of medium sized lysimeters units at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station at Uvalde for determination of crop coefficients on vegetable crops. Recently, I designed a large lysimeter and reference lysimeter for measuring ET and for determining crop coefficients for the state of Colorado. I co-developed the North Plains PET Network (NPET). Many other ET networks in the state have patterned their systems after the NPET, including the South Plains ET Network (SPET), the West Texas ET network and the PIN network in Uvalde, TX. I coordinated the merger of the NPET and the SPET networks in to the Texas High Plains Network. I supervised the development of all the programming and integrated, automated computer to computer communications and Internet distribution facilities of the TXHPET. The TXHPET system distributes faxes about 210 faxes “nightly” and has increased its Internet hits averaging over 4,300 per week for this valuable data. Annually, the network disseminates over 300,000 pages of data. I currently manage operations and development enhancements of the TXHPET. In 1994, I assumed the role of Superintendent for the TAES – North Plains Research Field (NPRF) near Etter, Texas. Under my leadership, a focus on research and extension (R&E) quality and assistance to northern Texas producers was re-established along with major infrastructure upgrades. More scientists, extension personnel and agencies conduct experimental and educational activities today at the NPRF facility than in any time in the facilities’ history. I was the senior engineer involved in the Senate Bill 1 for “Region A” which evaluates water planning and use over the next 50 year horizon. Subsequently, we developed a new irrigation water demand methodology for water planning purposes and in Senate Bill 2 this model was updated to current cropping trends for the Texas Water Development Board, the state water agency. In subsequent work, we developed irrigation estimates, using the TAMUS model, for other regions and developed parameterization for statewide applications. In addition, I am fully endeavored in Precision Agriculture research and in the process of developing the concept of a true, variable rate irrigation nozzling and control system as it particularly relates and applies to Texas High Plains producers. The concept has the potential to revolutionize current irrigation nozzling design for center pivot irrigation systems. The concept is currently under patent review by TAMUS-TAES.
