Good afternoon,

For your upcoming pre-planning meetings, there is a new requirement to discuss how the planning group will conduct interregional coordination and collaboration regarding water management strategies during development of the 2026 Regional Water Plans. To support this effort, attached you will find supporting data on water management strategies from the 2021 Regional Water Plans. TWDB's guidance provided in May on addressing this requirement at the pre-planning meeting is also attached for reference.

The two spreadsheets contain the following information:

1. *20210601_2022SWP_SelectRecommendedWMServingMultipleRegions.xlsx*: Spreadsheet includes 1) data description tab, 2) summary supply data for recommended water management strategies serving more than one region, 2) detailed supply data for recommended water management strategies serving more than one region, 3) recommended projects related to the strategies, and 4) the relationship between these strategies and projects.
Similar information from the 2021 Initially Prepared Plans was provided to the Interregional Planning Council for their consideration during meetings held in 2020.
2. *20210601_2022SWP_AlternativeWMSupply&Project.xlsx*: Spreadsheet includes 1) data description tab, 2) detailed supply data for all alternative water management strategies entered into the state water planning database, 3) alternative projects related to the alternative strategies, and 4) the relationship between these strategies and projects.
