SUBJECT: Jackson County County-Wide Drainage District General Revenue Grant – Dry Creek Drainage Project – Project No. 21934

ACTION REQUESTED

Consider authorizing the Executive Administrator to execute an agreement with the Jackson County County-Wide Drainage District for a \$12,000,000 grant pursuant to Senate Bill No. 1, 89th Legislature, Regular Session, Article IX, Section 17.18 (16).

BACKGROUND

Jackson County is located approximately 100 miles southwest of Houston, Texas and encompasses 857 square miles with a population of 15,284 residents.

To reduce flooding impacts from Dry Creek within the drainage district boundary, the Jackson County County-Wide Drainage District (District) was appropriated funding to conduct a drainage study and complete mitigation improvements. The project will include developing enhanced hydrologic and hydraulic modeling, evaluation of flood reduction solutions, excavation and channel widening, and stabilization of the channel side slopes of Dry Creek.

KEY ISSUES

The Legislature specifically directed the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) to provide funds for the above stated purpose. Consequently, the TWDB may provide funds from the general revenue account without reference to the requirements of other TWDB programs. The conditions necessary to affect the financing are only those necessary to protect the interests of the TWDB and document the transaction to the satisfaction of the Executive Administrator.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD
APPROVING AN APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE
TO JACKSON COUNTY COUNTY-WIDE DRAINAGE DISTRICT
FROM THE GENERAL REVENUE FUND
THROUGH A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,000,000

Recitals:

The 89th Texas Legislature, through House Bill 500, 89th Leg. R.S., Article VI and Senate Bill 1, 89th Leg. R.S., Article IX, appropriated to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) an amount not to exceed \$12,000,000 out of the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of constructing a flood project for Jackson County County-Wide Drainage District (District).

The District seeks financial assistance in the amount of \$12,000,000 in grant funds to finance flood improvements identified as Project No. 21934.

In accordance with its duties and responsibilities under Texas Water Code § 6.012, the TWDB has considered all matters required by law and in particular the instructions of the 89th Legislature.

The TWDB hereby finds that the project is eligible to receive funds in accordance with House Bill 500 and Senate Bill 1.

NOW, THEREFORE, based on these findings, the TWDB resolves as follows:

A commitment is made by the TWDB to Jackson County County-Wide Drainage District for a grant in the amount of \$12,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund. This commitment will expire on June 21, 2027.

Such commitment is conditioned as follows:

1. This commitment is contingent on the District executing a Grant Agreement in a form and substance acceptable to the Executive Administrator.
2. The Grant Agreement must contain a provision that the District agrees to comply with all of the conditions set forth in the TWDB Resolution.
3. The Grant Agreement must contain a provision that the TWDB may exercise all remedies available to it in law or equity, and any provision of the Grant Agreement that restricts or limits the TWDB's full exercise of these remedies shall be of no force and effect.
4. Financial assistance funds are public funds and, as such, the Grant Agreement must include a provision requiring that these proceeds shall be held at a designated state depository institution or other properly chartered and authorized institution in

accordance with the Public Funds Investment Act, Government Code, Chapter 2256, and the Public Funds Collateral Act, Government Code, Chapter 2257.

5. Financial assistance funds shall not be used by the District when sampling, testing, removing, or disposing of contaminated soils and/or media at the project site. The Grant Agreement shall include an environmental indemnification provision wherein the District agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and protect the TWDB from any and all claims, causes of action or damages to the person or property of third parties arising from the sampling, analysis, transport, storage, treatment and disposition of any contaminated sewage sludge, contaminated sediments and/or contaminated media that may be generated by the District, its contractors, consultants, agents, officials and employees as a result of activities relating to the project to the extent permitted by law.
6. Prior to closing, when any portion of the financial assistance is to be held in escrow or in trust, the District shall execute an escrow or trust agreement, approved as to form and substance by the Executive Administrator, and shall submit that executed agreement to the TWDB.
7. Before closing, the District shall submit to the escrow agent a closing memo signed by the Executive Administrator.
8. The District must immediately notify TWDB, in writing, of any suit against it by the Attorney General of Texas under Texas Penal Code § 1.10(f) (related to federal laws regulating firearms, firearm accessories, and firearm ammunition).
9. The District shall submit progress reports with sufficient documentation on costs on a quarterly or monthly basis to allow for the timely distribution of the grant funds.
