## Clean and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds Emerging Contaminants and Lead Service Line Replacement Project Priority Invitation

### *Project Information Forms due April 4, 2025*

The Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) invites entities to submit information on projects to be included in the current fiscal year's Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act projects for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF), Lead Service Line Replacement (LSLR) Program and Emerging Contaminants (EC) Program Intended Use Plans (IUP).

To be included in the initial project priority lists for the current state fiscal year, entities must submit a completed project information form (PIF) **by Friday, April 4, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. CST:**

*The TWDB is not able to use the Online Loan Application System (OLA) for these submittals. PIFs **must** be submitted by email using the Microsoft Word version of the form. Please submit the PIF (and any attachments) as **one PDF**.*

**If your entity submitted a PIF for a previous IUP** under the LSLR or EC program, but was not invited to submit a full application, you are encouraged to submit a PIF for this IUP cycle. Please submit a new PIF, using the current form, to be considered for this IUP cycle.

**To be eligible for the SFY 2025 CWSRF-EC or DWSRF-EC financial assistance**, the proposed project must reduce exposure to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and other emerging contaminants through drinking water or help address discharges through wastewater and, potentially, nonpoint sources. All project funding will be in the form of principal forgiveness. More information is available on the [TWDB Emerging Contaminants Program webpage](#). The TWDB may also use PIFs received under this new DWSRF EC program to consider funding under the separate EPA Emerging Contaminants in Small or Disadvantaged Communities Grants program.

**To be eligible for SFY 2026 DWSRF Lead Service Line Replacement financial assistance**, projects must be a lead service line replacement project or associated activity directly related to the identification (including service line inventories), planning, design, and replacement of lead service lines, and the system must be DWSRF program eligible. The entity's project area must also meet new disadvantaged criteria specific to this program, as outlined in the PIF. All project funding will be in the form of 51 percent principal forgiveness and 49 percent loan. More information is available on the [TWDB DWSRF Lead Service Line Replacement Program webpage](#).
