Dear Mr. Ward:

I am submitting the enclosed Desired Future Conditions ("DFCs") of the groundwater resources in Groundwater Management Area 6 ("GMA 6"), pursuant to Section 36.108 of the Texas Water Code. Groundwater Management Area 6 ("GMA 6") is comprised of four groundwater conservation districts in North Central Texas: Clear Fork Groundwater Conservation District, Gateway Groundwater Conservation District, Mesquite Groundwater Conservation District, and Rolling Plains Groundwater Conservation District. The member districts of GMA 6 have worked together over the past few years, in coordination with the Texas Water Development Board, to unanimously adopt initial DFCs that will protect and conserve the groundwater resources of North Central Texas.

The GMA 6 DFCs are based on the Texas Water Plan and the Texas Water Development Board's applicable Groundwater Availability Model runs for all relevant aquifers within the boundaries of Groundwater Management Area 6: the Ogallala, Dockum, Blaine, and Seymour Aquifers. The GMA recognized that the Trinity Aquifer is not relevant to GMA 6 and is not included in its DFCs (see attached meeting minutes for the July 22, 2010 GMA 6 meeting).

METHODS USED TO DETERMINE DESIRED FUTURE CONDITIONS

TRINITY GROUP AQUIFERS The GMA members considered the TWDB Slivers Analysis Paper, the GMA 8 Desired Future Conditions as adopted, and TWDB general guidance and determined that the Trinity Group Aquifers within Groundwater Management Area 6 were not relevant for joint planning purposes.

BLAINE AQUIFER The Desired Future Conditions are based on the values in Table 4, GR 08-44. The DFC for Collingsworth, Hall and those portions of Childress County in the Mesquite GCD are based on the Mesquite GCD Management Plan.

DOCKUM AQUIFER The Desired Future Conditions for Dickens & Motley Counties are based on the High Plains UWCD DFC values as suggested in the TWDB Slivers Analysis Paper. The remaining values are based on values from Table A-1, GAM Task 10-025.

OGALLALA AQUIFER The Desired Future Conditions for Dickens & Motley Counties are based on the High Plains UWCD DFC values as suggested in the TWDB Slivers Analysis Paper.

SEYMOUR AQUIFER The Desired Future Conditions are based on the values in Table 3, GR 08-44. The DFC for Collingsworth, Hall and those portions of Childress County in the Mesquite GCD are based on the Mesquite GCD Management Plan.

These conditions are viewed only as starting points for GMA-6 to go forth for the next five years as charged.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. § 36.108, the presiding officer, or his designee, from each of the four Districts in GMA-6 are obligated to engage in ongoing joint planning to, among other things, establish the DFCs of the aquifers within GMA-6;

The analysis paper recommended that GMA 6 consider the DFCs adopted by the adjacent GMA 8;

WHEREAS, GMA-6 carefully studied the DFCs established by GMA 8 when determining the DFCs for the Trinity Group Aquifers, and chooses to honor those DFCs;

WHEREAS, GMA-6 also believes the DFCs to be generally consistent with the 2006 Regional Water Plans for Regions C and G, and the 2007 State Water Plan:

The Desired Future Condition for that part of Childress County located in the Gateway Groundwater Conservation District; Cottle, Foard, and Hardeman Counties, also located within Gateway Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 2 feet over the next 50 years
 - c. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Childress County located in the Mesquite Groundwater Conservation District; Collingsworth and Hall counties, also located within the Mesquite Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby 50 percent of the current volume in storage will remain in 50 years (2060)
 - d. The Desired Future Condition for King, not located within a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 7 feet over the next 50 years
 - h. Desired Future Conditions for Dickens, Knox, Motley, Stonewall, and Wilbarger Counties, located in GMA-6, are not relevant for joint planning purposes.

GMA-6 recognizes that each District's boundaries may change due to the consolidation or annexation of land in GMA 6 that is either in or out of a district, therefore, the consolidated or annexed land will follow the rules, regulations, and Desired Future Conditions of the receiving District. RESOLUTION NO. 2010-005

OF GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT AREA 6 ADOPTING DESIRED FUTURE CONDITIONS FOR THE SEYMOUR AQUIFER

WHEREAS, Groundwater Management Area 6 ("GMA-6") is comprised of twenty six counties located in North Central Texas and encompasses four groundwater conservation districts – the Clear Fork Groundwater Conservation District ("Clear Fork District"), the Gateway Groundwater Conservation District ("Gateway District"), the Mesquite Groundwater Conservation District ("Mesquite District"), and the Rolling Plains Groundwater Conservation District ("Rolling Plains District");

WHEREAS, GMA-6 unanimously supports the following goals, ideals and standards for GMA-6. The GMA-6 member Districts have worked to learn the rules and goals of each individual district, and the adjoining Groundwater Conservation Districts in GMA-1, GMA-2, GMA-7 and GMA-8 along with the history of how each District has arrived at their different management philosophies. The members of GMA-6 agree and support the Desired Future Conditions ("DFCs") as set out below. These conditions are viewed only as starting points for GMA-6 to go forth for the next five years as charged. The members of GMA-6 agree that monitoring is necessary to measure the depths and scope of the Seymour Aquifer, where it exists, and to manage these groundwater resources to achieve these DFCs;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. § 36.108, the presiding officer, or his designee, from each of the four Districts in GMA-6 are obligated to engage in ongoing joint planning to, among other things, establish the DFCs of the aquifers within GMA-6;

WHEREAS, such joint planning has been undertaken, and is ongoing, by the four presiding officers or designees of the Districts;

WHEREAS, the representatives of the Districts in GMA-6 have met as required by Section 36.108 of the Texas Water Code for joint planning not only to set the initial DFCs,

WHEREAS, the Scymour Aquifer consists of substantially different characteristics and conditions across its boundaries; is defined by geographically separate and distinct areas known as "PODS"; and pursuant to Texas Water Code Ann. § 36.108, when considering the adoption of DFCs, GMA-6 is obligated to and has considered the "uses or conditions of an aquifer within the GMA that differ substantially from one area to another" and may adopt different DFCs for different areas overlying an aquifer;

WHEREAS, GMA-6 also believes the DFCs to be generally consistent with the 2006 Panhandle and Regions B & G Regional Water Plans and the 2007 State Water Plan;

WHEREAS, the DFCs adopted by the GMA on this date are subject to future revision;

WHEREAS, the GMA desires to honor the mandates of Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code, including private property rights, and desires to treat everyone in a reasonable manner given the extreme diversity through the area;

WHEREAS, the GMA desires to inform the citizens of the Management Area about the Seymour Aquifer, the diversity of the aquifer and its uses and conditions, and the challenges of groundwater management with minimal impact to the local economy;

WHEREAS, the GMA has worked closely with the Texas Water Development Board, their hydrologists and other qualified professionals to base the adopted Desired Future Conditions on the best available science;

WHEREAS, the GMA is striving towards the intent of the joint planning process and is fully committed to continuing this important process and achieving the ultimate goal to conserve and preserve the aquifer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT AREA 6 THAT:

 - b. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 1 in Childress County that is located in Gateway Groundwater Conservation District is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 1 foot over the next 50 years (2060)
 - c. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 3 in Motley County and that part of Pod 4 in Childress, Foard, and Hardeman counties, located in Gateway Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 1 foot over the next 50 years (2060)
 - d. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 4 in Wichita and Wilbarger counties, not located within a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 1 foot over the next 50 years (2060)
 - e. The Desired Future Condition for Pod 5 in Archer, Clay, Wichita and Wilbarger counties, not located within a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 2 feet over the next 50 years (2060)
 - f. The Desired Future Condition for Pod 6, that part of Pod 7 in Baylor, Knox and Haskell Counties, and that part of Pod 8 in Baylor County, located in Rolling Plains

Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 18 feet over the next 50 years (2060)

- g. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 7 in Stonewall County is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 24 feet over the next 50 years (2060)
- h. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 8 in Throckmorton & Young Counties, none of which are located in a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 3 feet over the next 50 years (2060)
- i. The Desired Future Condition for Pods 9 & 10 in Kent and Stonewall counties, not located within a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the ttotal decline in water levels will be no more than 4 feet over the next 50 years (2060)
- j. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 11 in Fisher County, located in Clear Fork Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 1 foot over the next 50 years (2060)
- k. The Desired Future Condition for that part of Pod 11 in Jones and Stonewall Counties, and Pods 12, 13, 14 & 15, located in Jones County, not located within a Groundwater Conservation District, is that condition whereby the total decline in water levels will be no more than 1 foot over the next 50 years (2060)
