As a long-time weekend resident of the Lake Fork community who is soon to become a full-time retiree there, I am writing to express my concern about state water usage as it affects Lake Fork. As you are well aware, Lake Fork has served a larger community than the immediate area because of its excellent fishing. It draws tournaments, tourists, and seasoned fishermen from much further away that the confines of Texas because of its reputation.

On a personal level, over the past two years my husband and I have seen the water level at Lake Fork decrease to the point that water no longer touches the supports of our dock. If the Lake Fork Reservoir Project allows significant amounts of water to be pumped from the lake to Dallas after 2007, permanent economic damage to the region will occur as well as damage to the many permanent (not vacation home) residents of Lake Fork.

Please consider utilizing other water sources to satisfy the voracious lawn-watering appetites of DFW residents who use excessive amounts of water. While certain areas of DFW have had to comply with mandatory water restrictions, the Dallas Morning News has apprised the public of abuses [August 16, 2006].

Those of us who live at Lake Fork will appreciate your serious consideration of our concerns as the 2007 Water Plan is formulated.
